

## 2025 IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS



**37** individuals were served through Habitat's critical repair program

**18** critical repair jobs were completed to address health and safety concerns

More than half (**56%**) of repair projects served households that included a person with a disability

**\$26,442** was the median income of our repair clients

Habitat spent **\$151,694** on the critical repair program



**1100** volunteers generously donated over **15,700** hours of service

This fiscal year, the ReStore did **\$662,712** in sales. Over **\$3,000,000** in proceeds has been contributed to Habitat programs since the ReStore opened in 2005.

Through sales, an estimated **861,526 pounds** of material were diverted from landfills. On average, every \$1 in sales keeps 1.3 pounds of waste out of the trash.

The recycle program raised **\$28,536** through the resale of **138,925 pounds** of aluminum cans and scrap metal.

**\$54,640** was the average income of our homebuyers

Habitat revitalized **6 homes** in the Town of Ashland, through our new **Neighborhood Revitalization** project.



We enhanced both homes and the neighborhood with minor repairs and improvements such as new mailboxes, porch lights, and exterior cleaning.
